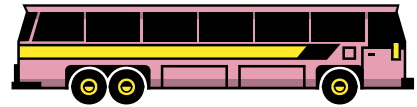

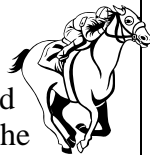

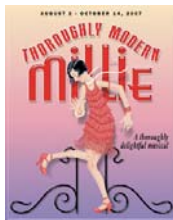

Recipe Corner

Original Girl Scout Cookie

- 1 C Butter, softened
- 1 C sugar 2 eggs
- 2 Tbls milk 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 ½ C flour
- 2 tsp baking powder

In bowl, cream butter & sugar. Add eggs and beat well. Add milk & vanilla and beat until fluffy. Combine flour and baking powder. Gradually add to creamed mixture & mix well. Chill 2 hrs or overnight.

Bake in pre-heated oven to 350 degrees. Roll out dough to ½ inch thickness. Cut with trefoil cookie cutter (or other shape). Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 8-10 minutes, or until lightly browned.
