Tax Assistance for seniors

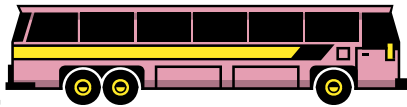

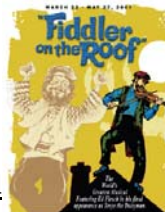

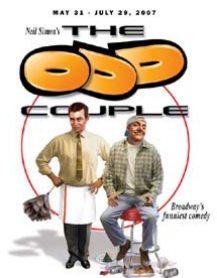

Recipe Corner

Chocolate Streusel Bars

1 ¾ C unsifted flour

1 ½ C confectioners' sugar

½ C unsweetened cocoa

1 C cold margarine or butter

1 8oz cream cheese softened

1 14 oz can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk (not evaporated)

1 egg, 2 tsp vanilla extract, ½ c chopped nuts

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In large bowl combine flour, sugar and cocoa. Cut in margarine until crumbly (mix will be dry).

Reserv 2 C crumb mixture. Press remainder firmly on bottom of 13X9 inch baking pan.

Bake 15 minutes. In large mixer bowl, beat cheese until fluffy, gradually beat in sweetened condensed milk until smooth. Add egg and vanilla mix well. Pour over prepared curst. Combine nuts with reserved crumb mix; sprinkle over cheese mixture. Bake 25 minutes or until bubbly. Cool. Store covered in refrigerator.
