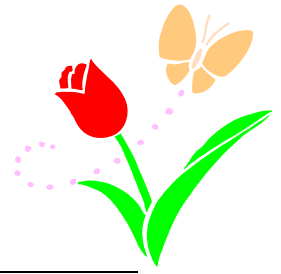

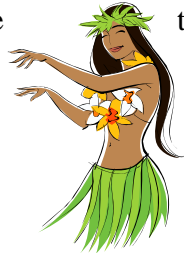
Celebrating Older Americans Month

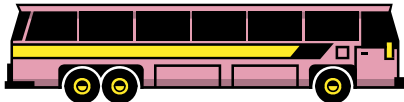
