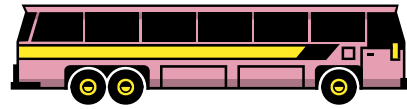
Tax Assistance for seniors

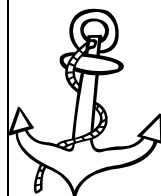
