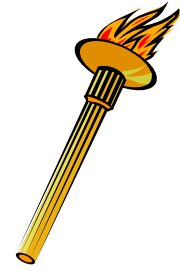

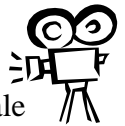

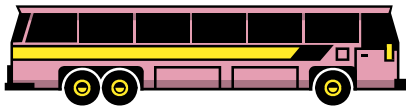


**Ozaukee Senior Games

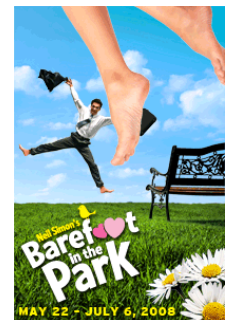

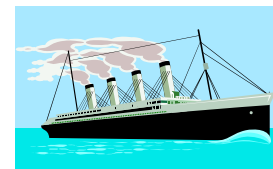
