**Director's Report**

Each member needs to stay informed and remain in contact with elected officials to keep this process a priority. There may be federal stimulus money available for this type of project.

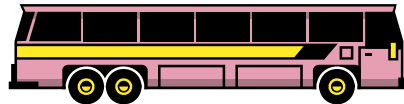
### Tax Assistance for seniors

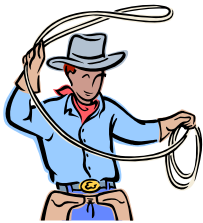
