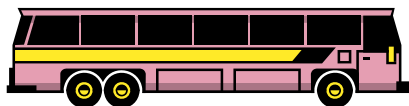

### **Niederkorn Library Homebound Service**

For homebound residents the service will provide the delivery of books or audio books into your home once or twice a month. The library automation system allows us to configure your delivery choices based on your likes and dislikes. A selection of materials will be dropped off each visit and the old materials returned to the library. If you are interested in signing up for homebound delivery we will need your name, address and phone number. A staff member will then visit your home to discuss

the details of the service including the number or materials to be dropped off each visit, the frequency of visits and personnel likes and dislikes in literature. After the initial visit each resident will be matched up with a single dedicated volunteer.

Residents desiring homebound delivery should call the library so that the initial visit and the profile in the system can be set up for service starting in October.

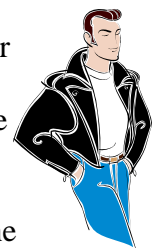
