Director's Report

The Senior Center annual report is being completed for the City. Your legible sign in on every visit to the Center is important for this report to the Common Council. The Center had 1080 visits in December, up 216 from Dec. 2008! The Dining Site was up over 800 meals through November 2009 so there was an average of 80 more members or guests per month at the Center.

There has been growth in many of the regular activities of the Center. The scheduling of programs needs to be coordinated through the office (Director) to balance available space with the dining site, special events, community programs, and regular member group activities, as well as staff time. This corresponds to the need for modern senior center space. It is not always easy to accommodate all the various groups and member interests. We do our best with the city allocated staff time and space.

The Site Selection Committee continues to work on reviewing sites. This year, they will develop criteria for downtown sites and then apply the criteria to available sites. It is important for members to keep talking to their alderman about the modernization and share opinions with them & committee members: John Sigwart, Suzanne Brunner, Bud Johnson, Clyde Weiland, Dick Stoughton, Ann Augustine, Bonnie Knab, Jim Olson, and Paul Ehrlich.

The office will have more volunteers in February to help out while the new assistant

recovers from surgery. If you would like training for regular projects, contact Catherine.

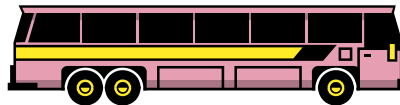

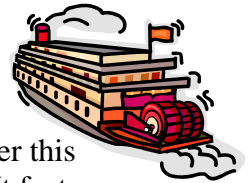
